Proposed Bylaws 2019 vote at Annual Meeting on APRIL 8, 2019

July 1, 2019 will begin a newly restructured Northeast Metro (MN) Branch. With the restructuring of our branch, concentrating on what fits for our membership, we need a fresh start with new bylaws. We have been working on proposing *Bylaws 2019* using our current *Bylaws 2016* as a base. The **vote** by membership on the **proposed Bylaws 2019** will take place at the AAUW Northeast Metro MN Branch **Annual Meeting on April 8, 2019**. At our annual meeting, amending our bylaws requires a two-thirds vote after a guorum is attained. A guorum is 25% of our members.

As you review the proposed bylaws for our restructuring remember, "The purpose of the AAUW Northeast Metro MN Branch will be for leadership to help members stay connected to AAUW, working to further the mission of AAUW and working to connect local branch members with each other."

The *Proposed Bylaws 2019* and the supporting documents *2019-Policies and Procedures* plus *2019 Standing Rules* are available for your viewing is in our web pages https://nemetro-mn.aauw.net under the MEMBERS ONLY tab on the tool bar near the top of the page. To get into the MEMBERS ONLY area you will need the confidential password found on the branch 2018-2019 Directory (bright green). Look on the center of the page under the $\star\star\star$ Branch Information $\star\star\star$ to find the Member-only confidential password. Call any of us if you have questions.

You reviewed the proposed branch documents, now what? Be ready to Volunteer To those people remaining members next year, <u>you now know</u> during the 2019 Annual Meeting your peers will be anticipating your *volunteering yourself* for jobs or tasks you'd like to do to help our branch continue. Please note, being a volunteer branch means during the meeting you volunteer yourself *not* someone else.

Volunteering members determine what we offer. At minimum we will have four business meetings a year. Having accompanying discussions or activities at business meetings and gatherings during other months depends upon volunteers.
